<input type="checkbox"/>	A copy of your Electronic Student Aid Report (SAR) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Emailed to you after your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is processed
<input type="checkbox"/>	A copy of your Financial Aid Notification of Award must be uploaded by April 1, 2020 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> From your college of choice or colleges you are considering
<input type="checkbox"/>	An official high school transcript directly from the high school (include fall grades)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Verification of ACT/SAT score on transcript <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A copy of your score report (make sure it has your name on it) if your scores are not on your transcript

<input type="checkbox"/>	An essay in 500 words or less <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Describe an attribute, quality or skill that distinguishes you from everyone else and how you developed this attribute, quality or skill.
